CONSULTATION GUIDELINES

Each monthly consultation will focus on one of the five FST Phases as outline in the **FST Module Flowchart**. To fully prepare for each Consultation Session, it is important that you complete the following tasks:

- 1. Prior to each consultation, read/review the specific chapters in your *Treating the Traumatized Child* book
- 2. Review the corresponding Lessons from the Module(s), if needed
- 3. Submit your paperwork documenting your delivery of the skill(s) of focus for that consultation session **no later than 48 hours prior to the consultation** (templates needed for paperwork will be provided to you prior each consultation session), along with any specific questions you have related to the application of the skill.
